Claudell Williams Brinson, 85years 10 months and 8 days, entered into the presence of her Savior on Wednesday December 14, 2016. She was born February 5, 1931 in Sulphur, Oklahoma to Claude P & Edna R. (Bretch) Williams. She graduated from Sulphur High School in 1948.

Caudell attended Stephens College in Columbia, MO, and later the University of Oklahoma where she met a handsome young man, Hugh E. Brinson, Jr. They were married on March 22, 1951, in Sulphur, living in Oklahoma City until 1955 when they decided to make Sulphur their permanent home.
