Flora would have been 105 years young on June the 29th. Flora married Ludy Francis Hairell in Tishomingo on February 6, 1936. Flora was a resident of Johnston County for the first 103 years of her life. Above all, she loved people and loved to cook and raise a garden. While maintaining a home and raising 5 children she had time to work outside the home for many years.

Flora was preceded in death by her parents, Robert and Mettie Thompson; her husband, Ludy Hairell; five of her brother and sisters; one daughter, Kathy Hairell, and one son James Hairell.
