Fred Alan Fink, 68, resident of Sulphur, passed away peacefully on Saturday, April 1. at Oklahoma City. He was surrounded by loved ones at the time of his death.

Fred was born November 19, 1948 in Independence, Kansas, to Vernon and LaVerne Fink. He graduated from Tulsa University. On July 16, 1971, he married the love of his life and his best friend, the former Cinda Gaylyn Parks, in Ardmore. Fred loved movies, antiques and experienced tremendous pleasure in helping others in the community. Blessed with a youthful spirit, Fred was a kid at heart and an avid collector of Hot Wheels and was known for entertaining people on Fourth of July with an amazing fireworks display.

He is survived by his wife Cinda of 45 years, mother LaVerne Fink, daughter Kristin Suchomel and her husband Jason Suchomel, daughter Kaelin Fink, grandson Zachary, granddaughters Cora, Kinsley and Quinn, brother Paul Fink and wife Peggy, brother Larry Fink and wife Cathy, brother Glen Fink and wife Claudia, and 9 nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his father, Vernon Fink.
