Gen Boyce joined God's choir April 28, 2014. She was born March 1, 1922 in Chicago, Illinois to Albert and Anna Kobak. A World War II bride, she met Vernon MacArthur ("Mac") Boyce during his basic training at Navy Pier. They were married in Jacksonville, Florida in 1943, and after the war returned to Oklahoma to live on a farm near Wynnewood. Gen and Mac moved to Sugar Land, Texas to be closer to their families in 2000, and were married for 61 years, until Mac's death in 2004.

Gen loved music and her Church, singing and serving at various times as organist, music director, and lay Eucharist minister at St. Catherine's and St. Francis Xavier Catholic Churches while living in Oklahoma. She also enjoyed being a part of the local music club for many years.

She returned to college later in life, graduating with honors from East Central University in Ada in 1971. After this, she launched her teaching career as an English teacher in the Wynnewood Middle School.

Survivors include her daughter and son in law (Rose) Anne and Stan Keller, her grandchildren Eric, Jonathan Taylor, and Erin Keller of Sugar Land, Texas, her sister Alice Kobak Phipps of Ontario, California, and many nieces, nephews, and friends. Her family shares her love of music, playing, singing, and appreciating it in all its forms.





I remember when my younger brother, Glenn fell from the top of our slide and broke his arm. Dad was not there and Mom did not have a car and we did not have a phone. She yelled for one of us to run to Mrs. Boyce and ask if she could drive her to the emergency room (20 miles one way to Sulphur and 3 hours to sit and wait). Another year later, somehow my younger brother, Michael got his hand caught in the swamp cooler fan and cut up real bad. Again, Dad was not home and Mother yelling, "Go get Mrs. Boyce and tell her it is an emergency"

I can remember Mrs. Boyce inviting me to go with her daughter, Rose Anne to the the Circus. What a treat!!! I am so blessed to have a friend like Rose Anne. I can remember spending the night with Rose Anne. The next day, Mrs. Boyce homemade caramel covered apples rolled in crushed walnuts. Mrs. Boyce was a great cook and firmly believed in prayer before every meal.

Her faith in God showed thru all the charity work she did. I remember two different years Mrs. Boyce brought material to the Joy School and her portable sewing machine and spent an hour each day to help me make a dress for the 4-H fair. Ya know, I won Reserve Grand Champion!!! The judges said that if I had of used covered buttons instead of shiny buttons that I would have won!!! I was so proud of that beautiful dress and I was so proud of Mrs. Boyce for being my friend and spending her time with me.


I think after Rose Anne entered high school Mrs. Boyce went to college and received her degree to be a teacher. I know she was a great teacher because Rose Anne was so smart the first grade teacher placed her in the second grade immediately and Rose Anne was still the smartest person in the second grade :) Good Job, Mrs. Boyce. You raised a fine daughter!!!

I know I will close this tribute and then think of something else. Mrs. Boyce legend goes on and on. You will live in our hearts forever.
