Funeral Services for Mr. Howard W. Cade, Sr., 73, of Tishomingo, Oklahoma will be held on Monday, August 19th, 2013 at 2:00 p. m. at the United Methodist Church with Pastor Will Pascieczny officiating. Mr. Cade passed away on August 16th, 2013 at the Mercy Hospital in Ardmore, Oklahoma.

Howard was born on March 2nd, 1940 in Shreveport, Louisiana to Allan D. Cade and Susie Elizabeth (Bryant) Cade. He graduated from Byrd High School in Shreveport and later served in the United States Navy from 1958 until 1961. During his military career, he served aboard the USS Kearsarge. After his honorable discharge, he attended and graduated from the Clarinda Community College in Clarinda, Iowa with an associates degree in Business. Howard worked for many years for the Wilson Packing Company, in the receiving department and from which he retired. He liked to fish and hunt and was an accomplished trap shooter, having won many awards. For several years, he worked as a color commentator while announcing football games on KMAD radio. He acquired the name "Old Uncle Howard" from this association.

He was preceded in death by his parents.

Howard is survived by two sons, Wayne Cade of Minnesota and Scott Cade of
