James Gilbert Sharp “Bud” was born July 27, 1941 in Fresno California to James and Lucretia Sharp. Bud went to the Lord on November 11, 2022, Veterans Day, at the age of 81 from medical complications.

As a US Navy veteran, Bud was an aircraft mechanic aboard numerous aircraft carriers and went on to support humanitarian operations in the Alaskan Earthquake off the Kodiak islands. After leaving the Navy, Bud joined Tinker AFB until he retired in 1987.

Bud and Patsy enjoyed family time at the flea markets, driving around town in old cars, eating at the local restaurants, and mentoring their grandchildren. Bud enjoyed joking around with his grandchildren and teaching them how to fish. He always had a gift in hand or a word of wisdom to pass on. Bud was always

there to help anyone anyway with whatever.

A multi-talented man, Bud carried a bag of talents too long to list. He took on the task of building a farm just east of Wynnewood with his son. His most enjoyable moments on the farm were with the many dogs he took in off the street to give love, warmth and shelter. 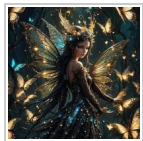
