



Dr Keith Owen Tribble

July 14, 1948 - October 26, 2017

Keith Owen Tribble, a resident of Sulphur was born July 24, 1948 in Goffstown, Massachusetts to William A. & Annette (Callan) Tribble. He passed away Thursday October 26, 2017 at Sulphur, Oklahoma at the age of 69 years 3 months and 2 days. He moved with his family at a early age to Jaffrey, NH in 1958 and graduated from Keene High School in 1966. Keith attended Fordham University, received a Masters Degree in English Literature from the University of Leeds, England, and a PHD in Modern Languages and Literature from the University of Washington at Seattle. He served in the US Army as a Russian language translator in Berlin, Germany. During his career as a Russian Language Professor at Oklahoma State University, he created an exchange program for Russian professors during which he taught in Kazakhstan, Kirghiz, and Uzbekistan. He hosted professors from those countries at his home in Stillwater, Ok. Having studied piano at the Manhattan School of Music, Dr Tribble used his musical ability, once staging a production of "The Music Man" with his English students at Samark and Institute of Foreign Languages in Uzbekistan, to teach English as a second Language. He was a member of the Catholic Faith.
