Lana was a member of the Stratford Round up Club and queen in 1967, also valedictorian in her 1967 graduating class. She advanced her education at East Central University completing a bachelors degree in math and two masters degrees in counseling & school administration. After college she went on to teach high school for 27 years, following retirement from education she became an auditor for Walmart, working there almost 19 years. Lana was a very disciplined and driven woman, expecting the same of her students, many of whom took the solid base Lana instilled in them to further their own successful careers. It made her very proud to hear of her students achievements.

Lana was a member of the Stratford Free Will Baptist church where she very much enjoyed singing and playing the piano. She also found great joy in quilting, sewing and listening to almost any genre of music.
