After attending Wynnewood High School, he moved to Houston, TX for a short time before enlisting in the United States Navy. He honorably served at Fleet Operations Control Center Pacific Fleet where he was involved in the communications for the first manned moon landing. His later part of his naval career was served in Vietnam. Upon returning to Oklahoma, Larry worked for the City of Oklahoma City, Public Works Dept., and after 34 years of service, he retired as Interim Field Services Superintendant.

Larry was a 32nd Degree Mason and Past Master of Westwood Lodge Number 512. Larry enjoyed being an avid "ham" that is an amateur radio operator with a General License.

He was preceded in death by his father, mother, stepmother, brother, nephew, and grandparents.

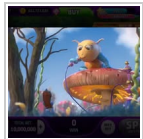
