



## Lee Cargill

February 18, 1927 - December 13, 2017

Funeral Services for Mr. Lee Cargill, 90, of Fillmore, Oklahoma will be held on Thursday, December 21, 2017 at 11:00 a. m. at the Fillmore Church of the Nazarene with Brother Dusk Monetathchi officiating. Interment will follow in the Condon Grove Cemetery in Milburn, Oklahoma with Military Honors provided by The Chickasaw Nation Honor Guard. Mr. Cargill passed away on December 13, 2017 at the Oklahoma Veteran's Center in Sulphur, Oklahoma.

Lee was born on February 18, 1927 in Fillmore to Ervin J. Cargill and Mary Clara (Callen) Cargill. He grew up in Johnston County and after high school served in the United States Army during WWII. Lee married Roberta Askew on September 9, 1949 in Pampa, Texas and they lived in California for a number of years before returning to Johnston County in 1975. He retired from the Uniroyal Tire Plant in Ardmore, Oklahoma and then moved to his farm in Fillmore, after living in Tishomingo for several years. Lee was proud of his military service and was a member of the VFW Post #4869. He was very instrumental in helping to make the new Veteran's Center in Tishomingo a reality.

Lee was preceded in death by his parents; his wife, Roberta; his brother, David "Crat" Cargill; and four sisters, Sylvia Autrey, Thelmet Sizemore, Onita "Cissy" Johnson and JoAnn Pynchon.

He is survived by his daughter, Sharon Hill and husband J. L. of Friendswood, Texas; his son, Brett Cargill of Tishomingo; grandchildren, Leeann Crabtree, Leslie Hardin, Candace Cargill and Cole Cargill; great-grandchildren, Savanna & Robert Crabtree, Tyler, Reed and Chloe Hardin; other relatives and friends.
