Linda and her family attended Fillmore Church of the Nazarene for all the time they lived in the area. She taught different Sunday School classes for many years, from children to adult women. She was very dedicated to making sure her children were in church on a regular basis.

Linda loved to travel. She made a trip to Europe, many trips in the USA and many different cruises. She was also an avid quilt maker. Her quilts were treasured and caused a sense of competition as the main prize of the annual family Christmas bingo game. She was an accomplished cook. Her dumplings were considered a delicacy at the monthly church social. She was great at traditional meals and open to trying just about any type of recipe she thought sounded good. 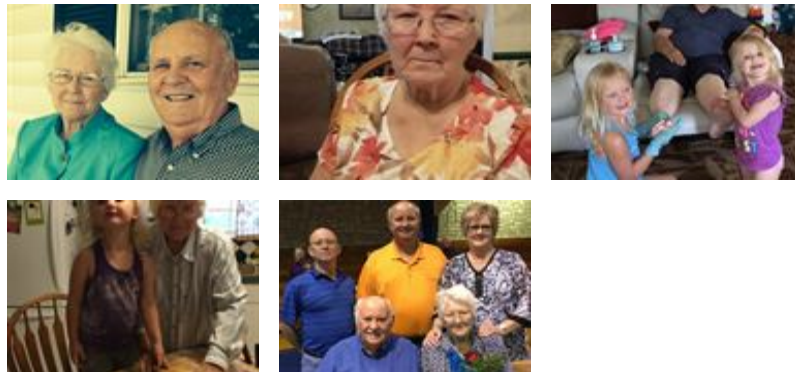
