Mildred worked many years at Indian Territory Home Health and in her later years worked for the Chickasaw Nation where she retired due to health reasons. Mildred made a commitment to Christ and was very dedicated in her faith. She loved to go to church and would hardly ever miss until she was unable to attend due to her health. She always put God first in everything that she did. Mildred was the type of person you could always count on to pray for you. Mildred's favorite times were spent with her family, she loved Thanksgiving and Christmas and having her family together. She often times hosted cookouts and always made sure those she loved were cared for and had plenty to eat. She was a big supporter and loved all her nieces and nephews. She attended all her niece's sport games. She often gave her nieces, Tina Nichols and Cheyanne Arkansas, tips on what to do in games. Mildred was a

caretaker of her family; she spent her last days surrounded by her family. Being the nurturer that Mildred was, during her last words, she made time with each one of her loved ones sharing special departing words. Mildred did not want to leave, but knew she was being called home and wanted to make sure her family would be okay and be comforted. Mildred fought a hard battle, until God said no more or pain, come on home.
