Neal kept his team disciplined and was determined to ensure they dominated on the field. Neal lead his team successfully to win two all state championships. His hard work and dedication payed off with him graduating with honors from Wynnewood high school in 1991. After graduating high school Neal achieved a scholarship in football to play for North Eastern Oklahoma in Miami, Oklahoma. Neal graduated NEO with an associates in business and a Juco Championship to add to his accomplishments. Neal went to continue his college career at the University of Las Vegas where he played free safety. Neal proceeded to relocate closer to home, attending Oklahoma Community College where he received his bachelors degree in business.
