Noble Jobe, Jr. was born in Ada, Oklahoma on January 16, 1934 to Noble Jobe, Sr. and Dora Mae Todd Jobe. He attended school in Ada and served in the United States Army from 1953 until 1955, during the Korean Conflict. After his discharge, he attended East Central University in Ada where he earned his bachelor's degree allowing him to teach Industrial Arts. Mr. Jobe spent thirty years educating students in the Choctaw Public School system in Choctaw, Oklahoma. He passed away on Tuesday, September 14th, at the Medical Center of Southeastern Oklahoma in Durant, Oklahoma at the age of 76. He was preceded in death by his parents.

Mr. Jobe is survived four children; Denise King of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, Catrina Baker of Newcastle, Oklahoma, Vanessa Oldham of Midwest City, Oklahoma and Dr. Noble Jobe III and his wife Donna of Tishomingo, Oklahoma; eight grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren; he also is survived by one sister, Jane Coffman of Ada; other relatives and friends.

Mr. Jobe had been a resident of Tishomingo for the past six years where he enjoyed the outdoors. He spent many hours hunting and fishing with family and friends.
