Funeral Services for Mr. Raymond V. "Ray" Rowe, 88, of Tishomingo, Oklahoma will be held on Tuesday, July 3, 2018 at 1:00 p. m. at the First Assembly of God Church with Mr. Dustin Rowe officiating, assisted by Pastor Cordell Hines. Interment will follow in the Tishomingo Cemetery. Mr. Rowe passed away on July 1, 2018 at the Mercy Hospital in Tishomingo. After his schooling, he moved to Washington State where he worked as a purchasing agent for Jones Construction Company, in the business of building dams. They moved to Tishomingo in 1969 and purchased the Dairy Queen which they operated for 42 years. He was also a member of The First Assembly of God Church.
