Rosemary D. Mullins, a resident of Sulphur was born April 16, 1923 in Indianapolis, Indiana to James W. and Rosa May Denham. She passed away Saturday April 30, 2016 at Sulphur, Oklahoma at the age of 93 years and 14 days. Rosemary grew up in Indiana, graduating from Indiana School for the Deaf. She moved to Great Falls, Montana where she received her Bachelors Degree in Deaf Education. She later achieved her Masters Degree in Deaf Education from the University of Tennessee. Rosemary and Richard Mullins Jr. were married on June 6, 1943 in Indianapolis, Indiana.

He preceded her in death on Sept. 9, 1991.

She had lived in Sulphur since 1975 and taught English and Reading at Oklahoma School for the Deaf. She was a member of Sulphur United Methodist Church.
