



Samuel Francis Pamp Howe

February 16, 1915 - January 24, 2005

Pamp was born in Sulphur to Charles Francis & Myrtle (Bailey) Howe. He moved with his family at age 3 to the Nebo community. He graduated from Sulphur High School in 1933. He was married to Mozelle "Slick" Blackwell Howe at Ardmore on June 16, 1934. She preceded him in death October 12, 1998.

In 1938 the Howe's established the first Grade "A" milking barn in the Southern Oklahoma area and started marketing their product through a milk processor in Ada. He was instrumental in organizing a milk marketing cooperative in Murray County, where he served as president/manager. Later the Central Okla. Milk Producers Assn. (COMPA) was formed. He was acting manager when COMPA consolidated with Associated Milk Producers in 1967. He was manager of AMPI Okla Division, and later the general manager of Southern Region AMPI.

He received numerous awards and honors for his work in the community and state. He received the 1st Governors Outstanding Achievement Award in agriculture. Also the Okla. Farmer & Rancher in 1964, served on the following boards: Federal Land Bank, Murray County Soil Conservation, Murray county Farm Bureau, Murray County Farm Cooperative, Arbuckle Rural Water Assn., Okla. Assn. of Electric Cooperatives, Okla. Dairymans Credit Union, Peoples Electric Cooperative Board of Trustees, Arbuckle Memorial Hospital Board, Murray County & Okla. Cattleman's Assn.

He was a member of the Vinita Ave. Church of Christ where he served as a

elder for many years.

He was preceded in death by 3 brothers: Pete, James & Bailey Howe a sister: Catherine Mann, and a foster brother J.E. Parker.

He is survived by: Daughter & her husband: Dorothy & Richard Shive, Son and his wife: Pat & Marilyn Howe 5 Grandchildren & 9 Great Grandchildren
